Dear Mr. Secretary:

We are writing to request information that the Department of the Interior (DOI) has thus far refused to provide to Congress. More than six months ago Senator Jeff Sessions, the Ranking Member on the Senate Committee on the Budget, requested specific information regarding DOI's possible preferential treatment of certain renewable or alternative energy projects – all of which received taxpayer-funded loan guarantees. Despite repeated attempts to have this request fulfilled, DOI has not produced an adequate response. This is unacceptable.

Thus, we request the following information as soon as possible, but no later than noon on June 12, 2012. If you fail to comply fully with this request, we will have no other choice but to consider the use of compulsory process.

- 1. All communications involving Steve Black, referring or relating to any 1705 loan guarantee project;
- 2. All communications involving Janea Scott, referring or relating to any 1705 loan guarantee project;
- 3. All communications involving David Hayes, referring or relating to any 1705 loan guarantee project;
- 4. All communications involving Ned Farquhar, referring or relating to any 1705 loan guarantee project;
- 5. All communications involving Neil Kornze, referring or relating to any 1705 loan guarantee project;
- 6. All documents and communications referring or relating to Abengoa Solar, Inc.'s Mojave Solar project between January 20, 2009, and April 1, 2012;
- 7. All documents and communications referring or relating to BrightSource Energy's Ivanpah project between January 20, 2009, and April 1, 2012;
- 8. All documents and communications referring or relating to First Solar, Inc.'s Desert Sunlight project between January 20, 2009, and April 1, 2012;
