



Generational Investment in Border Security *(Updated Senate Homeland Security Title)*

Section 1: Build the Wall.

Provides Customs and Border Patrol \$46.5 billion in funding to build the Border Wall and associated infrastructure like access roads, cameras, lights, and sensors.

Section 2: Personnel Surge and Facilities and Fleet Improvements.

Provides \$4.1 billion in funding for a border personnel surge to hire and train Border Patrol agents, Air and Marine agents, and field support personnel. Provides \$2 billion for retention and signing bonuses for those agents. Provides \$855 million to repair and refresh Border Patrol's decaying vehicle fleet. And provides \$5 billion for the improvement of Customs and Border Patrol's facilities.

Section 3: Detention Capacity.

Provides \$45 billion for the detention of illegal aliens ICE has taken into custody pending their removal.

Section 4: Border Security, Technology, and Screening.

Provides \$6 billion for improvements to surveillance at the border, including air and marine operations and efforts to combat drug trafficking, as well as screening persons entering or exiting the country.

Section 5: State and Local Assistance.

Provides \$10 billion in grant funding to reimburse states for border security efforts during the Biden years. Also funds key Administration priorities: \$500 million for state and local capabilities to detect threats from unmanned aerial systems; \$625 million for planning and security costs relating to the 2026 FIFA World Cup; \$1 billion for planning and security costs related to the 2028 Olympics; and \$450 million for the Operation Stonegarden grant program to equip state and local law enforcements to cooperate with Border Patrol's efforts to enhance border security.

Section 6: Presidential Residence Protection.

Provides \$300 million to reimburse state and local law enforcement for supporting the Secret Service's work to protect the private residences of current and former Presidents.

Section 7: Additional Homeland Security Funding.

Provides an additional \$10 billion to the Department of Homeland Security to ensure adequate funding for border security across the board.
